Action Gets Results

Kurt Lewin, the founder of group dynamics, said, "There is nothing so practical as a good theory." Successful organizing relies on sound theories. This month we highlight the theory that direct public action can get results when traditional lobbying fails. Public action can alert and inspire the public and allies to a support campaign. To illustrate this, we highlight a 19 day around the clock vigil that the Student Immigrant Movement (SIM) held about 6 years ago on



the steps of the Massachusetts State House to stop several anti-immigrant amendments from being included in the state budget. Several conclusions can be drawn from this action:

- Public action that includes personal physical sacrifice (In this case, sleeping outside on a hard stone surface with no protection from the rain) can inspire broad support
- Direct action, even when there is a specific commitment to NOT being arrested can be effective. (The undocumented youth made an agreement to not be arrested since arrest could result in their deportation)
- When traditional lobbying is not getting results and the consequences of legislation threaten basic human rights, direct action can be effective.

Jose said, "In Massachusetts we faced a situation where the State Legislature was about to pass many anti-immigrant policies as part of the state budget. The amendments t would prohibit companies from hiring undocumented immigrants. It would create an 800 number for people to report anyone who "looked like an undocumented immigrant." It would prohibit Universities from enrolling undocumented students, stop health care for immigrants and establish other anti-immigrant policies. All these items were tied to the state budget which was

The idea of a vigil came up when we were meeting -- not about the budget amendments -- but about the Dream Act and In-State Tuition. Maria Peniche, one of our members, told us that her father would lose his medical coverage if this budget passed and he would have to go back to Mexico. So we decided we had to do something...
