I learned something about social media recently. I did some work for a new independent political



party and went to see a young man who had contacted the campaign because he had seen an ad on Facebook. He had been targeted thru a social media campaign as someone likely to be interested in an independent political party. Maybe because he is in a heavy metal band but I really can't say.

I went to have a one on one with him at a local coffee chain and listened as he told me what he cared about it. He was 20, had gone to high school in a working class city north of Boston, and was working at a supermarket where he had started as a bagger at 16. As I listened he told me when he got his first full time job, he had no idea about finances, or how to find and pay for car insurance.

"They did not teach us any of those things in high school," he told me. . "Why do you think something so practical was not in your high school's curriculum." I asked him, and later I asked him,

Tubal Padilla, of <u>NeighborWorks America</u> in Washington, DC, said that his organizer's edge, working among many community development corporations (CDC) across the US, is the NeighborWorks' **Community Leadership Institute**, (CLI) which trains thousands of community leaders at the grass roots.

Recently, he said:

"Many CDC's are developing their own leadership training, developing their own CLI's, using training that NeighborWorks America provides at its National Training Institutes. These leadership trainings vary. Some are focused on issues in the community, as a preamble to an organizing campaign. Some are to develop leadership, in some cases to funnel people to their Board of Directors. Some have a focus on skills. Some are more generally educational, with a focus on how systems work, how the government works, how the economy works. Most have a combination of both, and I think this is a very exciting development. Many are modeled on NeighborWorks' Building Leaders, Building Community curriculum, which is taught at their National Training Institutes. Some have partnerships with universities and are quite structured."
